

Los Angeles's exciting new homegrown art collective **Creative Underground LA** presents two flagship ensembles, **Slumgum** and the **Daniel Rosenboom Group**. The two bands explore broad sonic terrain, from acoustic swinging jazz to atmospheric electric soundscapes and artful contemporary composition. Guest musicians include collective members **Cathlene Pineda** (piano), **Brian Walsh** (clarinets), **Jose Gurria** (drums), and many others.

LISA MEZZACAPPA TRIO FEATURING FAY VICTOR

Bay Area bassist **Lisa Mezzacappa** collaborates with Brooklyn vocalist **Fay Victor** in this East-meets-West-Coast trio. The trio's repertoire explores a wide-open concept of jazz language and feeling, with inspiration drawn from the earthiness of the blues, the sonic explorations of the avant-garde, the lean architecture of pop music, and a keen sensitivity to sound and groove. The two are joined by guitarist **John Finkbeiner**.

BURN LIST FEATURING CUONG VU

A product of Seattle's vibrant creative music scene, the collaborative quartet **Burn List** features West Coast jazz heroes **Cuong Vu** (trumpet) and **Greg Sinibaldi** (tenor sax) with next-generation players **Aaron** **Otheim** (keyboard) and **Chris Icasiano** (drums). The group's compositional aesthetic combines expansive melodies, driving rhythms, dreamily layered harmonies, and dynamic group improvisation, with musical influences ranging from Ligeti to Albert Ayler to Aphex Twin.
